Mrs Beverley Tyson, Marine Science Advisor

Mrs Tyson's professional background is a mix of Marine Biology and Science teaching. She has a BSc in Marine Biology and an MSc, in Marine Environmental Protection. Mrs Tyson has been teaching Science for 8 years and is thrilled to be able to combine her qualifications and experience in what she has said is her 'perfect job! Mr Andrew Parkinson, Maths Advisor

Mr Jonathan Lambdon, Maths Advisor

Students learn/consolidate group skills through language learning and their communication skills as a whole can develop further. Madame Laycock looks forward to interacting with all students in the school and hopes that they will enjoy learning and trying new French words even if they don't study French in school.

Madame Laycock would also like to share some tips for parents and guardians to help their children with their language learning:

A big congratulations goes to all students who have been taking part in the French lessons this half term. They are all doing very well and are trying their best to speak and understand French both spoken and written. I have been very impressed with their willingness to engage in all lessons which are naturally interactive lessons due to the need to produce the language. Hopefully, your children are coming home and either teaching yourselves or other relatives as this is the best way for them to practise their understanding and pronunciation.

In Year 7, students have learnt to greet each other with Bonjour (formal) and Salut (informal) to say Hello and how to ask How are you? Ca va? And reply by saying oui, ça va bien Yes I'm good oui, ça va très bien Yes I'm very good Bof! I'm fed up comme ci, comme ça so-so and Non, ça ne va pas No, I'm not good.

They have also learnt 1-15 and classroom objects which will help them speak as much French as they can in future lessons including classroom language.

In Year 8s and 9, students have been studying the topic of sports and musical instruments so they are able to say what they play and like/ don't like playing.

In Year 10, we have spent the first half term covering grammar before we move on to working towards their GCSE.
